The last will and testament of Samuel Harris
de do recorded this seventh day of December 1803.

In the Name of God Amen I William Wallace of the
State of Georgia and County of Lincoln being very poor
and weak in body but of perfect mind and memory
Thanks be given unto god calling into mind the mor
tality of my body and knowing that it is appointed
for all men once to die do make and ordain this
my last will and testament that is to say principally
and first of all I give and recommend my soul into
the hands of almighty god that gave it and my body
I recommend to the earth to be buried in decent Christian
burial at the discretion of my executors nothing doubting
but at the general resurrection I shall receive the same
again by the mighty power of god and as touching
such worldly estate whereunto it has pleased god to
bless me in this life after all just debts which I
owe first being paid I give and dispose of the

same in the following manner and form viz
first I give and bequeath unto Saml Wallan my
son the sum of one dollar twelve & half cents.

Secondly I give and bequeath unto Thoms Wallan
my son one half of the tract of land whereon I now
live including the mill on Savannah river with
the improvements. The dividing line to start half
way between the two corners on the river from
thence a straight line to the back line from the
river it being the lower half of said land and
the other half the said tract-land it being the upper
part I give and bequeath unto my son Robert
Wallan as also the sum of two hundred dollars
which I give the said Robert Wallan with the
above land. and the remaining part of my
movable property with all debts which are
owing to me I leave to be equally divided by
my Executors among my other four children
viz. Rebekah, Leonard, William Wallan, Abraham
Wallan and John Wallan by them to be freely
possessed and enjoyed and I do hereby utterly
disallow revoke and disannul all and every
other former Testaments Wills and legacies, bequests
and executors by me in any wise before named
willed and bequeathed ratifying and confirming
this and no other to be my last Will and testament
and I do hereby nominate and appoint John Wallan
and Robert Wallan and they are hereby nominated
and appointed by me to carry this my last
Will and Testament into ^{full} effect

The last will and testament of William Wallam die & recorded this 15th of Feby 1804

William Harper Esq.

In the name of God Amen I John Walker of Lincoln County and State of Georgia being sick and weak of body but of sound mind & memory Thanks be to almighty god for the same but calling to mind the Mortality of my body and knowing it is appointed for all men once to die do make and constitute this my last will and Testament. In the first place I recommend my soul to god who gave it and my body to the earth to be buried in a decent Christian Burial at the direction of my Executors hereafter named in here and certain hope that my body will be raised again by the mighty power of god to eternal life. As touching my worldly goods which it has pleased god to bless me with hereunto on me I dispose of in form and manner following Viz. I desire that my last debts may be paid out of my personal property if sufficient at the discretion of my executors. Then my will and desire is that my loving wife Sarah may possess and enjoy all of my property both real and personal for the use of her and my children during her my said Wifes natural life or widow hood but in case she should die in that case my will is that she may enjoy one third of my property during her natural life and after she dies the same to be equally divided among my children.
