In the Name of God Amen I William Wallace of the
State of Georgia and County of Lincoln being very feeble
and weak in body but of perfect mind and memory
Thanks be given unto god calling into mind the mor
tality of my body and knowing that it is appointed
for all men once to die do make and ordain this
my last Will and testament that is to say principally
and first of all I give and recommend my soul into
the hands of almighty god that giveth it and my body
I recommend to the earth to be buried in decent Christian
burial at the discretion of my executors nothing doubting
but at the general re-creation I shall receive the same
again by the mighty power of god and unto touching
my worldly estate wherewith it has pleased god to
bless me in this life. After all just debts which
are first due Lincoln County Wills 1796-1808

same in the following manner and form viz
first I give and bequeath unto James Wallan my
son the sum of one dollar twelve shillings and six pence.

Secondly I give and bequeath unto Thomas Wallan my son one half of the tract of land whence I now live including the mill on Savannah river with the improvements. the dividing line to start half way between the two corners on the river from thence a straight line to the back line from the river it being the lower half of said land and the other half the said tract land it being the upper part I give and bequeath unto my son Robert Wallan as also the sum of two hundred dollars which I give the said Robert Wallan with the above land. and the remaining part of my moveable property with all debts which are owing to me I leave to be equally divided by my executors among my other four children viz. Rebekah London, William Wallan, Abraham Wallan and John Wallan by them to be freely possessed and enjoyed and I do hereby utterly disclaim all and every other former testaments wills and legacies, bequests and executors by me in any wise before named willed and bequeathed & ratify my and confirming this and no other to be my last will and testament and I do hereby nominate and appoint John Wallan and Robert Wallan and they are hereby nominated and appointed by me to carry this my last will and testament into effect

The last will and testament of William Wallen
deceased recorded this 15th of February 1804

William Storper Esq. P.

In the name of God amen I John Walker of Lincoln County and State of Georgia being sick and weak of body but of sound mind & memory thank be to almighty god for the same but letting to mind the Mortality of my body and knowing it is appointed for all men once to die do make and constitute this my last will and testament. In the first place I command my soul to god who gave it and my body to the earth to be buried in a decent Christian manner at the discretion of my executors here after named in this and certain hope that my body will be raised again by the mighty power of god to eternal life - As touching my worldly goods which it has pleased god to bestow on me I dispose of in form and manner following viz. I desire that my just debts may be paid out of my personal property if sufficient at the discretion of my executors. Then my will and desire is that my loving wife Sarah May possess and enjoy all of my property both real and personal for the use of her and my children during her natural life or widow hood but in case she should die in that case my will is that she may enjoy one third of my property during her natural life

and after her death the other two thirds to my son
