

Will of D. Burroughs Ashley

In the name of God, Amen!

I, D. Burroughs Ashley, of said State and County, being of advanced age, deem it proper and right, to make a disposition of my property, do therefore make this my last will and testament, hereby revoking all others heretofore made by me:

- 1st Item I desire and direct that my body be buried in a decent and christian like manner, suitable to my circumstances and condition in life.
- 2nd Item I desire and direct that all my just debts be paid without delay, by me daughter Ellen A. Culver.
- 3rd Item I give and bequeath to my daughter Ellen A. Culver all of my property left after my death in consideration of her taking care of me & attending to my business in my old age until my death. And I hereby appoint my daughter Ellen A. Culver Executrix of my last will and testament this April 5th 1879.
