

Will of Levi Drandy.

State of Georgia In the name of God, I Levi Drandy,
Lowndes County of said State and County, being of advanced
age, but of sound and disposing mind
and memory, knowing that I must shortly depart this
life, do hereby right and proper that both as respects
my family and myself, that I should make a disposition
of the property, with which a kind providence has blessed
me, I do therefore make this my last will and testament,
fully revoking and annulling all others by me heretofore
made.

Item 1st

First - I desire and direct that my body be buried in a
decent and Christian manner, suitable to my circum-
stances and condition in life, my soul I trust shall
return to rest with God who gave it, as I hope for
redemption through the mercy and atonement of the blessed
Lord and Saviour Jesus Christ.

Item 2

I desire and direct that all my just debts be paid
without delay by my Executor hereinafter named and
appointed.

Item 3

3- I give bequeath and devise to son Silvester Drandy,
one hundred and twenty acres of land lying in the South
East corner of Lot of Land Numbered 36 - 1st District of
Lowndes County Ga. commencing at the South East corner
running due North 25 ch, thence N. 48 ch, thence S. 25 ch,
thence E. 48 ch. at the beginning. Silvester shall have what
stock there is in his and his Brother James Drandy's name
and on feather bed and its clothing.

Item 4

4- I give to my son Daniel Drandy one hundred and
twenty seven acres of land and a third, Lot of Land
No. 36 - 11 District of Lowndes Co. Ga. commencing at a
light-wood stake 25 ch from the S.E. corner, running
due North 26 ch, thence N. 48 ch, thence S. 26 ch, thence
thence E. 48 ch, to the beginning corner, the remainder
of said Lot of Land sold and equally divided among
my lawful heirs, to wit my wife Delila Drandy,
Christina Drandy, Elizabeth Drandy, Frank Drandy,
Levi Drandy Jr. Virginia Thacker, and Sarah Chitty, and
Maria Pugh's heirs namely, John Wayne Pugh, Georgia
Ann Pugh, the Green Wainwright Pugh, these three heirs shall
have this together with their share, equally divided
I purpose for my wife to live with my son Silvester
Drandy as long as she will or as long as she
can - I leave a home

my son, Silvester to have the income or benefit of the same, my personal property shall be equally divided among the above named sons. I hereby appoint my son Daniel Draddy Executor of this my last Will and Testament.
