

Last Will and Testament of N. E. Fry State of Georgia Soundest Faculty

I Noah E. Fry, of the County and State aforesaid, being of sound and disposing mind and memory, do make this my Last Will and Testament

Item 1st I desire and instruct that all my just debts be paid by my Executrix herein after named and appointed, as soon as the same can be done consistent with the best interest of my estate and without injury to my Executors

And my said Executrix is hereby vested with full power and authority in her discretion to settle said obligations and or to obtain extensions of time in which to pay the same

Item 2nd After the payment of just debts as provided in the first item of this Will I give bequeath and devise all the residue of my estate, both real and personal to my beloved wife, Fannie L. Fry, for and during her natural life, with full power and authority to her to possess, enjoy, sell and convey the same, on any part thereof, in her discretion without any limitation whatever

Item 3rd After the death of my said wife Fannie L. Fry, I give bequeath and devise what ever of my said estate, both real and personal, that may remain at the death of my said wife, to my Children, share and share alike, without reference to any gift or donation, that may have been made by me during my life time, to any particular child or children, should any of my Children die before my said wife, leaving child or children, then the offspring of such deceased child or children, to take the share the parent would have entitled to, were such parent then in life

Item 4th

I hereby constitute and appoint my wife Sophie E. Dry, Executrix of this my last will and testament, with full power and authority to sell and dispose of, in her discretion any part of my estate real or personal, at public or private sale, without obtaining any order of the Court of Chancery. And any other Court, for leave to sell the same upon such terms as to Cash or Credit as she may, in her discretion think best. She is hereby relieved and excused from making any inventory of my estate and from taking the oaths required. She is also hereby relieved and excused from making any returns of her receipts, paying my estate to the Court of the County of my residence at the time of my death. I desire and direct that if possible, the probate of this will in solemn form, and that thereafter she have full power and authority to manage my estate as fully and freely as I could myself do with I in life without any liability to account to my Children or either of them and without liability to account to any Court for her acting and dealing in the premises, paying my estate.
