

Will of Warren J. Harp.

I, Warren J. Harp of said County bearing of sound mind & disposing memory, do make this my last will testamentary.

Item 1st

To my son Jas. J. Harp I give & bequeath my rifle gun & five dollars in cash to be paid out of my estate.

Item 2nd

To my son Jas. R. Harp the sum of one dollar cash

Item 3rd

To my son Warren J. Harp I give & bequeath the sum of five dollars cash to be paid out of my estate

Item 4th

After the above above are all paid I desire that out of the remainder of my estate my burial expenses shall be paid said expenses not to extravagant but I desire that my body be buried decently & in such manner as shall be commensurate with my mean & circumstances in life

Item 5th

To my daughter Mary C. Harp all of the remainder of my estate whether real or personal for her sole use & benefit I do hereby give & bequeath with the following provisions to-wit if the said Mary C. Harp shall die without children then all of my estate bequeathed to her shall be divided among my grand children share & share alike except my grand daughter Ella Harp to whom I give nothing, all of the above mentioned property in turn I "except the following, my double barrel shot gun, my wash & clock sewing machine & feather bed to be converted into cash turned over to said Mary C. Harp, or her legally appointed appointed guardian, for for her sole use & benefit & in the event of her death without children then whatever of my estate that shall be unexpended in her hands to be disposed of as herein set forth
