

Last Will and Testament of A. H. Lane deceased
State of Georgia Lowndes County

In the name of God amen
I, A. H. Lane of the State and County aforesaid, being
of advanced age, but of sound and disposing mind
and memory and, believing that I must shortly de-
part this life, do hereby give and proper that I should
make a disposition of the property with which a kind
providence has blessed me.

I do therefore make this my last will and testament
hereby revoking and annulling all others ^{made} made by
me

I desire and direct That my body be buried
in a decent and Christian like manner suitable
to my station and circumstances in life

I desire and direct that all my just debts be paid
by my Executors as soon as possible and without
any unnecessary delay after my death.

If there should not be sufficient money and collect-
able indebtedness to pay my debts. I desire that
such crops provisions and personal property
real estate as can if necessary in the judgment
of the executors best be shared, sold at either
private or public sale a sufficient amount to
pay all my just debts

I desire and direct that all other property of mine
of every kind character description shall belong to my
wife, Gertrude Lane during her life or widowhood for
the support of her and such of our children as may
remain with her. The Gertrude Lane is to have full
control of the property and use the same in any
way she may desire. But she is not authorized
to sell or convey any of the property. Neither is it
subject to any contracts she may make. This
property is given to her for the sole purpose of secu-
ring a support for her and such of our children as
may remain with her

If my wife Gertrude Lane should die I desire
that all the property of every kind and description
shall after twenty days notice be given be sold to the
highest bidder and the proceeds be equally divided
between my wife Gertrude Lane and my
children to wit: Thomas Lane

James I. Wisnibaker, Sallie Johnson wife of B. H. Johnson, Annie L. Wadley wife of J. E. Wadley, Minnie Lane the Lane Ida Lane and Reuben Y. Lane, and said property when so divided shall be theirs absolutely without any restriction or limitation whatsoever.

From VIIth

I hereby constitute and appoint my son in law James I. Wisnibaker, B. H. Johnson and J. E. Wadley, Executors of this my last will and Testament.

From VIIIth

If any of the above named heirs should die before a division of said property and leaving children of their children shall receive their parents pro rata share of said property.
