The Will of Henry E. Moore

State of Georgia

Forrest County

In the name of God, Amen. I Henry E. Moore
of the County of Forrest and State of Georgia being about to depart
from this state of Georgia as a volunteer (soldier) in the service of my Country
(the Confederate States) & being desirous to arrange my worldly affairs
before my departure, do make & publish this my last Will & Testament
- and first I commit my soul to God who gave it & my body I desire
to be buried in my family burying ground by the side of the remains
of my wife (in this County)

My worldly affairs I dispose of as follows.

I do hereby constitute and appoint my Mother Mary Moore my Executor
She is hereby vested with full power to pay all my liabilities which have accrued
to me since living in this County - to collect all debts due me & receipt for
the same & buy or sell property at times she may deem fit - & to take complete
control of all of my affairs the same as her own without any application
or return to be made to the regular Court of Law regulating such
cases - to pursue such a course with my affairs as if I were
personally present & perform all the same.

I desire my Mother to be appointed Guardian of my children Alice M.
Nancy E. & Georgia a Moore & that she be vested with full power over
their persons & their property that is now or hereafter or vested in my self
& to manage & control their persons & their property as she deems best for their
interest with as full power as I am given.

In case my Mother should depart this life before my children should arrive
of age then it is my desire that my Brother Joshua E. Moore of the
County of Jones & Roger of Madison County, West Virginia be appointed
as their Guardian.

In Witness Whereof I the said Henry E. Moore to this my Will consisting
of the foregoing two pages of paper have set my hand & seal this 15th
of June 1861

The Will of James A. Dasher Sr. Georgia Gwinnett County

after my death

Thirdly I give and bequeath to my wife Margaret A. Dasher
Dollars and ^{plus} Sixty of the balance of my estate, to be
only devised and bequeathed to my wife in the above
in full extinguishment of her whole right of Dower
real estate, and the twelve months support allow
and to widows

Fourthly I give and bequeath to my sons James A. Dasher Jr.
Virgil P. Dasher and to my sons in law Lewis Byron
James B. Spier and M. C. Palmer five sixths of my
share and share alike

Fifthly I appoint my son James A. Dasher Jr. my executor
reposing all confidence in his honesty and ability
I declare that he give no bond, take no oaths, or
require to make any return to any court
and things in this behalf done
