

Copy of Geo. H. Moore's Will

State of Maine

In the name of God, Amen.
I George H. Moore of the State and County
aforesaid, being of sound and disposing mind and memory,
do hereby certify, declare and publish, this my last will and
testament in manner and form as follows, to wit: I do hereby give
all former will or wills by me heretofore made.

Item 1st

I give and bequeath to my wife Polly Moore the following
Six negroes. During her natural life, to wit: Peter a man, Mary
a woman, Caroline a woman, little Peter a boy, America a girl &
Caroline a girl, and after her death the said negroes are to
remain and become the property of my Grand Children, by my
Son Joshua G. Moore, late of said County, with the name of
Share and Share alike. I also give and bequeath to my said
wife Polly Moore, the Two following negroes to wit: Frank
a man and Henry a woman, and the plantation whereon I
now reside, containing two hundred two and a half acres
more or less, the said last mentioned negroes to remain in my
said wife and her heirs, and assigns forever, free from
the claim or control of all other persons whatsoever.

Item 2nd

I give and bequeath to my Grand Children, my living children
of my Son Joshua G. Moore, late of said County, to wit: all
the rest & residue of my estate of whatsoever kind not herein
before bequeathed, Share and Share alike, and to their heirs
forever.

I hereby nominate and appoint my Daughter in law Polly
Moore, and my Grand Son Young G. Moore, Executors and
administrators of this my said last will and testament.
In witness whereof I the said George H. Moore, have hereunto
subscribed my hand and affixed my seal this twenty third
day of December in the year of our Lord Eighteen Hundred &
thirty three.
