

Will of Charles Strickland (Continued)

- Sec. 5th I do hereby give grant, bequeath and devise unto my two younger children Joseph and Maria the one hundred and forty four head of Stock cattle, hitherto excepted in this my last Will to be used equally between them also the sum of four hundred dollars each in cash money for their own proper use and benefit. And I also do hereby give, unto my son Joseph the young Cornet and Saddle for his own proper use and benefit.
- Sec. 6th It is my will and desire that all the property possessed by me at my death should, to equally divided amongst all my legal heirs so far as premises and the balance to be sold if need, and the amount arising from sale or sales, to be equally divided amongst all my legal heirs, by said Executors herein after named except a small tract of land to be retained by said Executors to say, Four & one half acres for my beloved wife Ann Maria Strickland and my grave.
- Sec. 7th It is my will and desire that if any of my legal heirs, or their heirs should die leaving no heirs of their body, that the property so received, that is property received directly, or indirectly through me or my estate shall revert back and be disposed of as directed in Section Six of this my last Will.
- Sec. 8th I do hereby nominate and appoint my son Louis Strickland, Benjamin J. Strickland and my son in law Charles H. Moore, all of the State and County aforesaid, my Executors to this my last Will and Testament, and do require upon them the strict execution of their trust, by promoting the great object of my desire and wishes, as herein before expressed of disposition of my property.
- Sec. 9th In Witness Whereof I have hereunto set my hand and affix my seal this the Eighteenth day of July Eighteen hundred and Eighty three.
