

Will of John C. Waldhamer
Georgia
Gwinnett County

I, John C. Waldhamer, of the State and County aforesaid, being of advanced age, but still of disposing mind and memory, consider it expedient for me to make a disposition of the property of which I am possessor, and therefore make this my last will and Testament.

Item 1st I desire that all claims against my estate for medical or other attention and burial expenses shall be immediately paid.

Item 2nd Having no family of my own to provide for, I desire that my property shall be equally & ~~evenly~~ divided between my nephews and nieces, ~~namely~~ ^{hereinafter} named, (but that in the event any of them shall hereafter die; or have already died then their share shall be in their children) to wit: Sarah a Wimsbaker, Margaret Washer, Susan Permann, Ann Pennington, Gertrude Prime and the children of Georgianna, these being the children of my sister Elizabeth Washer deceased, Elizabeth Nisely, Martha Miller, Harriet Shy, Richard Wimsbaker Mary C. Wimsbaker, Margaret Miller, and the children of Caroline Cooper, these being the children of my sister Catherine Wimsbaker, Catherine Elf and David Waldhamer these the children of my brother William Waldhamer John C. Wimsbaker and James a Wimsbaker, the children of my sister Margaret Wimsbaker. I have not named John C. Wimsbaker and E. H. Wimsbaker for the reason that they have no children are not

Item 4th I hereby appoint Alexander C. Wimsor of the City of Savannah sole executor of this my last will and Testament, and reposing full confidence in his judgment and honesty, I desire that he shall not be required to give bond for any matter connected with the execution of this trust. ~~My executor~~ ^{My executor} giving authority to sell either publicly or privately, and with or without publication as he may determine any or all of my property real or personal or to sell and transfer any of my stocks or bonds in the same manner and without obtaining any order from any court.

* Item 5th I give Mariah Washer the sum of One Hundred Dollars remuneration for attention given during my illness.

Alm. 5th I hereby give and bequeath, to my said Executor, provided he shall accept said trust the sum of One Hundred and fifty Dollars, as compensation for his services in carrying out the same.
