

The Will of Israel W. Wallhouse.

I Israel W. Wallhouse of said state and County of advanced age, but of sound and disposing mind and memory, deem it right and proper to make disposition of my property, therefore make this my last Will and Testament.

- 1st First: I give and bequeath to the 'Christian Church' in Wallhouse of which I am a Member Two Hundred Dollars.
- 2nd Secondly: I give and bequeath to my Executors hereinafter named Two Hundred Dollars each as remuneration for their services in the Management and Administration of my Estate.
- 3rd Thirdly: I give and bequeath to my nieces Sarah A. Visintainer, Margaret A. Dasher, John C. Visintainer, Allen C. Visintainer, George A. Smith & Gertrude A. Payne, the daughters of my sister Elizabeth Dasher, Dr Ann C. Windy, Kate C. Day, and the Keller Mary C. Delinger and Margaret Keller the daughters of my sister Mary C. Visintainer & Dr Catharine C. Coffey the daughter of my brother William Wallhouse if they survive me, and the event either of them survive me, then to their children of my. Womb to the 'Children of my deceased niece Catharine Cooper in the right of their mother. Then if none of my Estate, will share to each niece and if dead to their children.
- 4th Fourthly: I give and bequeath to my nephews, William W. Dasher, David Wallhouse, John C. Visintainer, George A. Visintainer, James C. Visintainer & John A. Visintainer and John C. Visintainer upon the same terms and conditions as before in the bequest to my nieces the sum one fourth of my Estate.
- 5th Fifthly: I appoint Richard A. Visintainer of Putnam County my Executor and requesting all confidence in their honesty and disinterestedness, desire that they give no bond with or without nor be required to make any return to my heirs or their heirs in the whole, with the exception of a final return and settlement hereby authorizing and empowering them to sell and dispose of my Estate by my Executors privately or otherwise to effect a settlement of my Estate and to have my own hand written in the presence of my Executors or legal authority.

The Will of Henry E. Moore

State of Georgia

County of Gwinnett

In the name of God, Amen, I Henry E. Moore
of the County of Gwinnett, State of Georgia, being about to depart
from this state of War as a volunteer (soldier) in the service of my Country
(the Confederate States) & being desirous to arrange my worldly affairs
before my departure, do make, publish (this my last) Will & Testament
and first I commit my Soul to God who gave it, & my body I desire
to be buried in my family burying ground by the side of the remains
of my wife.

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My worldly affairs I dispose of as follows.

First I do hereby constitute and appoint my Mother Mary Moore my Executor
& she is hereby vested with full power to pay all my liabilities which have accrued
to me since living in this County - to collect all debts due me & receipt for
the same & buy or sell property at times she may deem fit - & to take complete
control of all of my affairs the same as her own without any application
or return to be made to the regular courts of Law regulating such
cases - to pursue such a course with my affairs as if I were
personally present & perform the same.

Second I desire my Mother to be appointed Guardian of my Children Alice M.
Henry E. & Georgia A. Moore & that she be vested with full power over
their persons & their property that is now guaranteed or vested in my care
& to manage & control their persons & their property as she deems best for their
interest with as much power as I am first.

Third In case my Mother should depart this life before my children should arrive
of age then it is my desire that my Brother Joshua E. Moore of said
County of Gwinnett & State of Georgia be appointed
as this Guardian.

In Witness Whereof I the said Henry E. Moore on this my Will consisting
of the foregoing two pages of paper have set my hand & seal this 13th
day of June 1861
