

Will of Charlott Wayman.

Georgia Lowndes County.

In the name of God, Amen!

I, Charlott Wayman, of said State and County, being of sound and disposing mind and memory, but of advanced age, and knowing that I must soon die do make, declare and publish this to be my last Will and Testament;

- Item 1st. First, I commit my soul to God who gave it. My body I desire shall be buried in a decent manner suitable to my means and circumstances. I direct that all my just debts be paid as soon after my death as possible;
- Item 2. Second, I give and bequeath to my son Samuel Williams, for ever in fee simple, thirty (30) acres of land to be laid off on the North end of my tract of land on lot number fifteen (15) in the fifteenth (15th) District of said County known as my "Knight Place" and also my cow named "Jest" and all her progeny and increase;
- Item 3. Third, To my daughter Mary Butler I give and bequeath for ever in fee simple, eighty (80) acres of land, to-wit part of land lot number thirty one (31) in the fifteenth (15th) District of said County, and which I call my "Johnson Place" to be laid off on said Tract South of and adjoining that part of the Johnson tract herein after bequeathed to my son Samuel in Trust for my daughter Martha. I also give to my daughter Mary, my cow named "Philly" together with her progeny and increase.
- Item 4. Fourth, I give bequeath and devise to my said son Samuel, in Trust for for my daughter Martha Waymans, all my "Knight Place" now herein before bequeathed to my said son Samuel Williams, and so much of my "Johnson Place" lying South of adjoining the said "Knight Place" as will be necessary to make Martha's tract the full measure of fifty acres; also my cow named "Philly" together with her progeny and increase. My said daughter Martha is to have and enjoy the full and free use and benefit of said land and Cattle and have all the rents issues and profits thereof; she shall be allowed to live on said land, keep, use and enjoy said Cattle if she, at any time so desires; but neither she nor any future husband she may ever have shall ever sell or otherwise dispose of the same without the written consent of her trustee first had and obtained; and should the said Martha die without leaving children or the representatives of children or the representatives of children all the property herein bequeathed in Trust for her use and benefit is to be equally divided between my said son and daughter, Samuel Williams and Mary Butler and their heirs, share and share alike.

Charlott Wayman's Will (Continued)

Item 5. Fifth, All the rest residue and remainder of the property, both real and personal, of which I die seized and possessed, I give and bequeath to said three Children, namely, Samuel Williams, Mary Butler and Martha Wayman, and their heirs, Share and share alike; but Martha's Share of the same is given to Samuel in trust for her use and benefit, with like trusts, uses, purposes, restrictions, directions and remainders as are contained in the fourth item of this my last Will and Testament.

Item 6. Sixth I hereby make, constitute and appoint my said Son Samuel Williams Executor of this my last Will and Testament hereby revoking all other wills by me heretofore made October 1, 1889.

Signed, sealed, declared and published, by Charlott Wayman, as her last Will and Testament, in the presence of us the undersigned who subscribed our names hereto in the presence of said Testator, at her special instance and request, and in the presence of each other This October 1, 1889.
