body shall be buried in a Christian like manner

Item 2nd I desire & will that all my just debts shall be
paid out of my Estate by my Executor herein
after mentioned

Item 3rd It is my Will and desire that my beloved wife
Catherine E. Wiggins shall have the following
property to wit: Anthony a negro man about
thirty years of age Mary a negro woman
of dark complexion about twenty five
years of age also five hundred dollars

Item 4th It is my Will and desire that all the
rest of my property with which a kind
providence has blessed me shall go to and
be equally divided between my children
William A. Wiggins Sarah Deale Ann E.
John C. Allen M. G. Martha F. Mary E.
Catharine E. Charles W. & Robert A. Wiggins
share and share alike

Item 5th It is my Will that the property Willen
to me by my father during my life
then to my children should go and
decend to them according to the provision
of said Will

Item 6th I do hereby nominate and appoint
my eldest son William A. Wiggins to
be the Executor to this my last Will and
Testament and execute & carry out the
provision of the same
