 the north half of lot number two Hundred & sixty
 two in the first district of originally Muscogee
 now Macon County also the two Hundred and
 Twenty five and the One half of two Hundred
 and twenty six in the same district & County
 also my negro man Elbert and my negro girl Soe-
 mia with my plantation Nagon my stock
 of Hays, Horses & Cows and my plantation
 Tools, House hold & Kitchen Furniture
 with my Corn & fodder and all that belongs
 to me to have and to hold until

her death for the use of her & my daughter Vinny
McKinney in my and after the death of my wife Mary
McKinney it is my wish that my Executor shall sell
the whole of my Estate at public outcry and
collect the money and equally divide the same
among my children I also wish my Executor to
pay my just debts and collect all debts due me
which shall be disposed of in the same manner
as the rest of my property I also appoint
Gideon Smith as my Executor to carry out my will
And I do disavow all other former Wills made
by me as null and void and declare this to be
my last Will and Testament

for my wife and brother to pay all funeral
expences and hold the ballance of the money for
her own purposes Likewise I make constitute
and appoint my son John S. Spurlin to be Executor
to this my last Will and Testament duly making
all former Wills made by me

 manner as the rest of my property I also
 appoint Edwin Smith as my Executor to
 carry out my will and I do disallow
