

Macon County I, George B. Low being well informed
of the intentions of my said wife & child to and
and expressing my assent & constitute this my
Last will hereby bequeathing all others to my said wife & child
following to wit:

1st I wish my body after my death to be buried in a
Christianish manner.

2nd It is my will that my daughter, Mary Jane Low shall
have all my Real Estate lying & being in the County of Macon
of said State.

3rd It is my love & desire that my beloved wife Lucinda & I
Low shall have the following negroes to wit:

My boy about thirty one or two years old & named his
wife & husband a child of the said Marian also my Parson
& the two match milly & a Negro Girl Sally eight or
nine years old It is also my love & desire that my
beloved wife Lucinda & I Low shall have the
said mentioned two on my farm in the said County & I
have the income of the said farm in proportion to the
share of the said wife & child.

4th It is my will that all the rest of my Negroes shall
go to & belong to my said daughter Mary Jane Low except
a Negro woman named Lucy & her two children Warren
a Boy & Caroline a girl which said Negroes I except to
I wish my Execution to take and keep until the said children
shall get old enough to go to school & then said said
children to the North & then & thus said said Lucy to work for
them & thus to keep them & give them a Liberal education
out of my Estate & to give the Boy Warren at the age of twenty
one year & Caroline & the said Caroline at the age
of eighteen years & undivided dollars which said sum of money
are to be paid out of my Estate Proceas.

5th It is my will & desire that my wife Lucinda & I Low
is supposed to be in the family way at the time
that if I should be blessed with another child & it should
be a daughter that the Real Estate & Negroes properly
already given to my daughter Mary Jane Low
should be equally divided between them one half given
to each of said child should be a Boy then the said
Real Estate is to go to & belong to him & the said Negroes

Wholly & my Share to be equally divided between them one
half to Sara Mary Child the other half to my Sister Martha
Jane Lane & if after the said birth either one of said Children
should die before the age of twenty one then in that case said
property to go & belong to the other one of said Children until of said
Children should be antedepended birth take place both die before
they attain at the age of twenty one or in case there is no birth
as is expected of the said Mary Jane Lane dies before she
attains at the age of twenty one then the said share & property
only to go to the equally divided between the Children of my brother
& sister except that my brother Thomas Lane is to have the same
property & share equally as if it had been divided between my brother
& sister in case of my Children dies in case of the death of my Child
O Children as before said my desire that in the said will there may
be made be given to the said Mary Jane Lane & Martha Jane Lane &
6th It is my will that my brother in law Samuel Whitedes & daughter
my sister Elizabeth Whitedes shall serve & so long as they both wish
to live in the place whereon they now live without any care or
charge to the same

7th It is my will that my Land in Choctaw should be sold by my
Executors & my wife Lucinda I desire to have the money raised
by the sale of the same

8th It is my will that the property given to my daughter Mary Jane
Lane shall be kept together on the farm & that my executor, employ
usually an officer to oversee to keep my mills going & my farms
in such order as shall be most profitable

9th It is my will & desire that my brother Thomas should be my
Executor to execute my said will & I do hereby appoint the
said Thomas Lane (my brother) Executor to the my said
Will of course & I hereby say that if I have appointed
let my said will & sufficed my Seal
