

Georgia, In the name of God Amen
Macon County, I Jackson Warren of said
State & County being Weak in body,
but sound mind & memory and knowing that I
must shortly depart this life world deem it
right and proper both as respects myself and
family that I should make a distribution of
the property with which a kind providence has
blessed me I therefore make this my last Will and
testament hereby revoking and annulling all others
heretofore made by me

Item 1st I desire and direct that my body be
buried in a decent and Christianlike manner
suitable to my circumstances and condition May
but I trust shall return to rest with god who
have as I hope for Eternal Salvation through
the blessed Lord and Saviour Jesus Christ whose upon
I have professed as I seem to have enjoyed for several
years

Item 2^d I give and bequeath to my beloved wife
Emeline Warren fifty acres of land Number
(163) which I now live on in County of Macon
with all the rights, meadows and appurtenances to
said lot of land and revenue of said plantation
tools for the farm

Item 3^d I give and bequeath to my beloved wife
Emeline for and during her natural life my
negro woman Siley about sixteen years of age
and her bodily increase and at the death of my
beloved wife Emeline the said negro Siley and her
increase to my beloved child Sarno multitude

Item 4th I give to my beloved wife Emeline six
of my best Stock &c

Item 5th I want the balance of my property to pay
my Indebtedness. Should the balance of my property
only pay my debts I want the remainder to go to my
beloved wife Emeline & Child Sarno multitude
I do hereby ordain and appoint and do by
these presents ordain and appoint that Primes
of the County & State aforesaid Executors

to this my last Will and Testament to execute and
carry the same in full effect in testimony whereof
I have hereunto set my hand and seal the 24th day of
March 1859
