 of a mare that we call Jane which is to be
 her own At my death, after my death I
 want all the rest of my horses and all my Cattle
 sheep and hogs sold after one years provisions
 for my wife and brother. to pay all burial
 expenses and hold the balance of the money for
 her own purposes likewise I make constitute
 and appoint my son John A Spurgeon to be Executor
 of this my last Will and testament hereby revoking
 all former Wills made by me
 In witness whereof I have hereunto
 set my subscribed my name and

affixed my seal the 18th day of June in
year of our Lord 1836
