I William E White of Said State and County being of a riper age and knowing that I must shortly depart from this world deem it right and proper both as respects myself and family that I should make a disposition of my property with which a kind providence has blessed me I therefore make this my last Will and Testament hereby revoking all others heretofore made by me

I desire and direct that my body be buried in a decent and Christian like manner suitable to my Circumstances & Condition

I desire and direct that all my just debts be paid by my Executor herein after named
I desire and direct that my lot of Land No one hundred by me in the Second district of originally Muscogee now Macon County Georgia as it is until my youngest child becomes of age and the family to remain on it and make a support if they desire and when my youngest child becomes of age I desire and direct that the said lot of land be sold and the proceeds thereof be equally divided amon all my children

I desire and direct that all the perishable property remain on the place to assist in supporting the family until my Executor herein after named should see that it is necessary to dispose of some part of said perishable property for the benefit of and for the interest of the family

I desire and direct that when my youngest child becomes of age that the perishable property then on hand be sold in commission with the land and the proceeds thereof be equally distributed among my several children

I constitute and appoint my worthy friend Mark McMullin Executor of this my last Will and

Testament to the March 4th 1859
