This is the last will and testament of Archibald Hart of the County and State of Georgia. In the first I resign my body to the dust from whence it came. I wished to be buried in a decent but plain manner. And my soul I commit to God who gave it.

As to my property of every kind in the first place I wish all my lawful debts to be paid and all the remainder of my property of every kind, ready money, notes and bills, Negroes, Lands & Stock of every kind, house hold and kitchen furniture and all other property of every kind to continue to my wife Fely Hart during her natural life or widowhood and provided she does marry then and in that case she shall be entitled to one third of all the estate during her natural life or widowhood to be worth it as she may think proper and at her death or marriage to be equally divided among all my lawful heirs except my son James O. Hart who shall have five hundred dollars less than any of the rest as I have paid that much for him and above the rest of my children.
