whose religion I have professed and
humbly trust enjoyed for forty years

2nd I desire and direct that all my
just debts be paid without delay by my
Executor hereinafter appointed

3rd Item I Give and bequeath and
devise to my beloved wife Nancy with
whom I have lived in the Ethnic-
genish for Sixty Two years - The lot of Land
whereon we now reside containing two
hundred and fifty acres more or less
and all the Stock belonging on
said Plantation and all the household
and kitchen furniture unremoved
during her natural life or widowhood
and after her death or intermarriage
I want all my Estate both real
and personal and an
equal division made with

4th Item I hereby constitute and appoint my beloved son James C Williams of this my last will and testament.

5th Item. Should my Executor and my wife deem it right and proper the disposal of any of my estate of a perishable nature I now empower them to do so.

6th Item. I give and bequeath to my daughter Amanda J Baxter a Cove by the name of Stick and a feather bed pillows and Bolster such as my beloved wife shall point out.
