this I give unto him exclusive of my
other children of this my last will
and testament.

4th It is my will that after the death of
my said wife Frances Williams that
all my say estate not therein disposed
of real and personal that remains
after supporting and maintaining my
said wife be sold and after paying
the necessary expenses the money when
collected to be divided among ^{my} ^{children}
the children of my Grand Children in
the following manner to wit my son
Elder Williams to have an equal and
distinctive share, my son Brady Wil-
liams to have an equal share, my
Daughter Nancy Williams to have
an equal share, my Daughter Anne
Brady to have an equal share, my
Daughter Elderly Williams to have an equal
share, my son Robert Williams an
equal share, exclusive of the land
and my negro woman Sini and

"The children of my dear Daughter Sally
Bourne, to wit, Robert, William, Allen and
Joseph Bourne they to have an equal
share that their father to have the
same distribution share that my
Daughter Sally Bourne did would be
willed to when she living on an
equal division

5th I also will unto my son Eliza
William's trust for my Daughter
Dolly Thompson an equal an distribution
of the money aforesaid to be by him
applied to their benefit and her chil-
dren's benefit if she should have
any in such manner and at such
times as he shall think proper

6th I do here appoint my beloved
Wife Francis Williams Executor
and my son Eliza Williams Executor
to this my last will and Testament

and forty three
