she have nothing more out of my estate

Fourthly - I have also given to my son Edmund D. Tait
one bed and furniture & sundry other articles of
furniture towards housekeeping - it is my Will that
she have nothing more out of my estate

Fifthly - I have also given to my daughter Frances W.
Cooper one bed and furniture & sundry other articles
of furniture towards housekeeping, housekeeping it
is my Will that she have nothing more out
of my estate

Sixthly - I have also given to my daughter Elizabeth Porterfield
one bed and furniture & sundry other articles of
furniture towards housekeeping - it is my Will that
she have nothing more out of my estate

Seventhly - I have also given to my daughter Emma H. Story
one bed and furniture & sundry other articles of
furniture towards housekeeping it is my Will that
she have nothing more out of my estate

eighty - To my well beloved wife Mary I leave all my lands
Negroe house hold & kitchen furniture and all other
Property which I may die possessed of Notes accounts &c
to wit all my real & personal estate to be by my said
beloved wife Mary held and enjoyed and to be by her
disposed of as she may think proper - but it is my
wish that should my grandson Robert L Fait Postlefield
conduct himself in a proper and becoming manner
that my said beloved wife Mary may give him
such property as she may think proper and at such
time as she may think proper - I also leave my beloved
wife Mary My sole Executrix and Samuel Long my
executors to carry this my last Will & testament into
effect -
