of all my property as soon as a
division can be had I want my
property all sold on the place I now
live by my Executors hereafter
mentioned and an equal division
made between them and my beloved wife

Thirdly The children that is married off
I have given the following property
to my son Miles B Vaughn horse saddle
bridle Bed and furniture worth thousand
dollars the balance of my son I want
to have the same amount of things as
they may come of age or marry off

Fourthly Martha Ann Waid I have give
off Bed of furniture cow & calf worth five
dollars and I want the rest of my
daughters to have the same amount
of things as they may come of age
The share of my daughter Mary McQueen

I want him to have the liberty at the division
of my property to choose some one in trust to hold
the part to prevent Andrina McKown from
getting said property as her has left her for several
years without any just cause

Firstly after paying my debts and legacies
as herein before expressed the balance of
property to be divided into ten equal shares
the following legacies to be entitled to a share

carry this my last Will and Testament into effect
