

Will of Abriham Jordan

Georgia Marion County

In the name of God Amen.
I Abriham Jordan of the County of Marion and the State of Georgia being of sound and disposing mind and memory and being desirous to settle my worldly affairs while I have strength so to do, do make and publish this my last will and Testament hereby revoking all wills by me at any time hereto fore made and first I commit my soul to God who gave it, and my body I desire to be buried in such a manner as my Circumstances in life would suggest and my worldly estate I dispose of as follows:

- First I will and bequeath that my executors here and after named shall pay with as little delay as possible all my just debts
- Second I will and bequeath that my beloved wife Sarah Jordan shall have the use of all my property both real and personal during her natural life keeping the same together and managing the same as she may deem best
- Third I will and bequeath that after the death of my wife Sarah Jordan that all my property both real and personal be divided equally amongst my heirs shown, and shown a like
- Fourth I hereby nominate and appoint George Lafayette Jordan and Peter S. Hall Executors to this my last will and Testament In witness whereof I the said Abriham Jordan to this my last will Consisting of our shut of papers have set my hand and seal this the 3rd day of December, 1878
