I Ambrose Chapman of said County and State being of advanced age and knowing that I must shortly depart this life deem it right and proper both as respects my family and myself that I should make a disposition of the property with which a kind Providence has blessed me, do therefore make this my last Will and Testament

1 Item I desire and direct that my body be buried in a decent and Christian like manner suitable to my circumstances and condition in life. My Soul I trust shall return to God who gave it whom I have and still hope for eternal salvation

2 Item I desire and direct that all my just debts be paid without delay by my Executor hereinafter appointed and I am unwilling my Creditors should be delayed in their rights especially as there is no necessity for delay

3 Item Feeling for the support and comfort of my beloved wife Elizabeth in her declining years I therefore desire and direct that my entire property consisting of land, mules, horses, cattle, farming implements of various kinds wagon Buggy Corn Shovel &c shall be kept and remain together for the benefit and comfort of my beloved wife Elizabeth for and during her natural life at her death said property to be equally divided among the four of the body

4 Item I hereby constitute and appoint my beloved sons David C. and Wm M. Chapman Executors of this my last Will and Testament (Signed) Ambrose Chapman

the Court that said paper be declared
to be the last Will and Testament of
said Testator and be admitted to
record as such
