

STATE OF GEORGIA MARION:

I, Arthur Albeyron Jordan being in bad health & feeble but of sound and disposing mind and memory and being desirous to settle my worldly affairs while strength and capacity, do make this my last will and testament, revoking all former wills that I have made.

1st.

I commit my soul unto the hands of my Creator who gave it, and my body to the Earth to be buried at Old Liberty burying ground in such manner as my wife sees fit. And as to such worldly Estate wherewith it has pleased God to intrust me I dispose of the same as follows:

1st:

I want all of my just debts paid out of such personal property as can be disposed with least disadvantage to my family. All the remainder of personal property and my real estate I leave to the use of my wife and minor children. At the death of my wife Arthur Albiron, all the property then remaining together with what may accumulate over and above a support for herself & minor children to be divided equally, provided all the children to-wit: Abe; Susan; Marnie C.; Lucy N.; Arna R.; Arthur A.; & James W. are of the age of Eighteen. If Arthur A. or James W. are under Eighteen years of age they or either of them under said age shall first be allowed Fifty Dollars for each year untill they are of said age. The remainder then to be divided equally between all of said children then living or having heirs of their own body. It is my will that my wife manage and controll the estate without being amenable to the Court or making any returns save the probating of this will.
