property I have left remaining I dispose
of in the following manner

My just debts I wish paid, then the
balance of my property of whatever it
may consist, that I may die possessed
of, I give grant and devise to my son
Barnabas Hart to him and to his heirs gen-
eral upon condition that he shall take
me and my wife Hettie and provide for
us and take care of us during our natural
lives

In conclusion of the foregoing I nominate
and appoint my said son Barnabas
Hart Executor to this my last will and testa-
ment
