

Will of N. B. A. Story. L.O. d

State of Georgia Marion County

In the name of God Amen,
I, Benjamin A. Story of said State and County
being of advanced age, but of sound and
disposing mind and memory, knowing
that I must shortly depart this life deem
it right and proper both as respects
my self and family that I should make a
disposition of the property with which a
kind providence has blessed me.

I do therefore make this my last will and
testament hereby revoking and annulling
all others by me heretofore made

First

I desire and direct that my body
be buried in a decent and Christian-
like manner suitable to my circumstances
in life - my soul I trust shall return
to God who gave it, as I hope for
salvation through the merits and atonement
of the blessed Lord and Saviour Jesus Christ

Secondly

I desire and direct that all my
just debts be paid without delay by my
executor herein - after mentioned named and
appointed

thirdly

I give and bequeath and devise to
my beloved wife Emily J. for and during her
natural life free from all charge and limitation
the following property to wit: a one third
interest in the plantation on which my
residence now stands and in which I now
reside - (except one hundred, (100^{1/4}) one and a
quarter acres of land number eighty (88)
eight in the fourth district known as
the Paul place, being one hundred (100^{1/4}) one
and a quarter acres of lot number one
hundred (103) and three - two hundred (200^{1/2})
two and a half acres of lot number one hundred
(104) and four - one hundred (101^{1/2}) one and a
quarter acres of lot no one hundred, (100, fifty
(50) two acres of lot number eighty, 89, nine-
two hundred two (200^{1/2}), and one half acres of
lot number one hundred, 120, and twenty
all in the fourth district of originally
Marion County, Georgia Wills

and fifty nine and
my house hold and kitchen furniture and

one third interest all the stock such as
mules horses cows hogs &c

Fourthly

I give and bequeath to my son
S. B. Story one half of the plantation now
occupied by me of the stock such as
mules horses cows hogs &c which plantation
is numbered and described in the above
article except a reserve for my wife Emily
for and during her natural life - which
is also named in article above and
except one half of lot of land known by me
as the Paul place

Fifthly

I give and bequeath to my daughter
D. A. Bell, wife of Joseph T. Bell for
and during her natural life for and
except from the debts of her present or
future husband one half of the plantation
now occupied by me - said plantation
is numbered and described in the
fourth article above and of the stock
such as mules horses cows hogs &c except
the half lot of land named above, known
as the Paul place and a one third
interest in said property reserved for my
wife Emily for and during her natural
life said property contained in this article
at the death of my daughter D. A. Bell
shall pass to and become the property of
the children and representatives of children
of said D. A. Bell forever

Sixthly

I will and direct that the property contained
in the two last articles above - be equally
divided between my son S. B. Story and my
daughter Dicy A. Bell so that in no wise
to interfere or be detrimental to the one third
interest bequeathed to my beloved wife Emily J.
which interest is to only exist for and
during her natural life and then upon to
and become the property of my son
S. B. Story and my daughter Dicy A. Bell
in the manner above named.

Seventhly

I give and bequeath to my grand
children Benjamin a Fulton and Melin T
Fulton Equally one hundred 100th one and
a great piece of land in number 88,
Eighty to 100 in the fourth District originally
municipal now Marion County said land
is known as the Paul place with all

the rights members and appurtenances to
said tract or parcel of land in anywise
bringing former in fee simple

Eighty

I give and bequeath to my son James A
Story lot of land number one hundred & 68,
and sixty eight, and lot of land number
one hundred, 185 and eighty five in the
first district of originally Muscogee
now Marion County, known as the Kemp
place each lot containing two hundred
20 1/4, two and a half acres more or less.
Said lots of land shall be free and
exempt from all debts and liabilities of said
James A. Story. Said James A. Story is to have
all the rights members and appurtenances
to each of said lots of land in anywise
bringing former in fee simple

Ninety

I give and bequeath to my daughter
Wiley A. Bell wife of Joseph T. Bell
one hundred and thirty six acres, 136,
of lot of land number seventy four
in the fourth district of originally
Muscogee now Marion County
said land being the same on which
said J. T. Bell now resides, the said land
contained in this article is to be free and
exempt from all the debts and liabilities of
the said Dr. Bell's present or future
husband and at the death of the
said Wiley A. Bell shall pass to &
become the property of the children and
representatives of children of said Wiley
A. Bell forever

Tenth

I will and direct that the residue
of my property both real and personal
whatever it may be - be equally divided
among all my children and representatives
of children

Eleventh

I hereby constitute and appoint my son
Saml. B. Story and my daughter Wiley A. Bell
executors of this my last will & testament

subscribed the same as witnesses
in the presence of said testator
and in the presence of each
other at Testator's request and
that said D. B. Story at the time
was of sound mind and
discretion and that he signed
his said will freely and
voluntarily of his own accord

adjudged that said will be declared
to be the last will of said D. B. Story
dec'd
