

Will of Charles Thewbest

Georgia } In the Name of God, Amen,
 Stewart County } & Charles Thewbest of said State
 and County } Being of advanced age and knowing
 that I must shortly depart this world, deem it right
 and proper both as respects myself and my family
 that I should make a disposition of the property with
 which a kind Providence has blessed me, & there-
 fore make this my last Will and Testament here-
 by revoking and annulling all others heretofore
 made by me.

Item 1st I desire and direct that my body, be buried in a
 decent and Christianlike manner suitable to my
 circumstance and Condition.

Item 2^d I desire and direct that all my just debts be paid
 without delay by my Executor hereinafter named
 as I am unwilling that my creditors should
 be delayed of their rights especially as there is no
 necessity for delay.

Item 3^d I give and devise to my beloved wife Nancy for
 and during her natural life lot of land number two
 hundred and twenty five (225) in the thirty first (31)
 district of Stewart County two hundred two and a half
 acres (204) with all the rights members and appurte-
 nances to said lot of land in anywise appertaining
 or belonging.

Item 4th The rest of my property of every description whatever I
 give and bequeath to my beloved wife for and during
 her natural life.

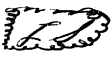
Item 5th I give and bequeath at the death of my wife to Sam-
 uel Anders the east half of the above described lot of
 land number two hundred and twenty five (225)
 the said lot of land to be divided from north to south
 and the said Samuel Anders to have the East half of
 said lot of land with all the rights members and
 appurtenances therunto belonging.

Item 6th I give and bequeath at the death of my wife to Mary Eleanor
 Anders (Daughter of Samuel Anders one bed and partition

Item 7th And I also desire and direct at my wife's death that
 the west half of the above named lot of land number
 two hundred and twenty five (225) be sold in terms
 of the law at public outcry and also the rest of
 my property both real and personal of every descrip-
 tion wherever it be found shall be sold according
 to law and the proceeds arising from the sale of the
 same and the rest of my property I desire to
 be equally divided among my two children namely
 John Thewbest and Mary Perry which I give and
 bequeath to them and to their heirs

Item 8th I hereby constitute and appoint my executor and
