I Daniel Shipps of said State and County being possessed of a sound mind and disposing memory, and feeling that life with me is uncertain, deem it right and proper both as respects my family and myself to make a disposition of the property of which I am now, or may die possessed, do therefore make and ordain the following things in writing as my last Will and Testament.

Item 1st I give and bequeath unto my son Daniel Shipps the sum of Five hundred dollars in money to be paid to him by my Executor out of any funds in his hands belonging to me.

Item 2nd I give and bequeath unto my daughter Susan Torrey wife of Francis Torrey the sum of One hundred dollars in money to be paid to her by my Executor out of any funds in his hands belonging to my estate.

Item 3rd I give and bequeath unto my daughter Mary Walker wife of Mr. Walker the sum of One hundred dollars to be paid to her by my Executor out of any funds in his hands belonging to me.

Item 4th I give and bequeath unto my grand daughter Louisa Walker the sum of One hundred dollars to be paid to her lawful guardian of my

out of any fund in his hands belonging to my estate.

Item 5

Whereas I have given heretofore to my son William Shipp, now deceased, a greater portion of my means and effects than to any of my other children, and whereas his widow and child still surviving; It is my will and I so direct that neither said widow or her child shall receive any portion of my estate.

Item 6

I give and bequeath unto my daughter-in-law, Emily Shipp wife of my son Henry Shipp an negro girl named Henrietta about twelve years old, one hundred and ten acres of land, being known as part of lot number (125) one hundred and twenty five in the 3^d Dist. in Chatahochee County containing one hundred and ten acres the place whereon the said Henry Shipp now lives; also the half of the undivided lot number (125) two hundred & three in the 10th Dist. of said County to be held in trust by her said husband Henry Shipp for the mutual use and benefit of said Henry Shipp and his said wife during the life of either of them. If he shall die first, said property to be held by a succeeding trustee during her life - for her use, and if my said son Henry shall die without children, said property to go to & belong to his brothers & sisters equally. Provided however before said trustee shall be authorized to settle, possession & charge of said property or any part of it, he and his said wife or either of them, shall pay or cause to be paid & satisfied the following notes to wit; One note for one hundred & thirty six dollars payable to E. J. Burt, due 1864 and signed by H. A. Shipp and David Shipp security, one note to M. P. Holli for ten hundred dollars due 1863 signed by H. A. Shipp and David Shipp security - one note to W. J. Lovitt signed by David Shipp first due - one note to W. B. Spivey for one hundred and six teen dollars due 1865 signed by H. A. Shipp and David Shipp endorser. And provided further that upon failure by said Henry Shipp & wife to pay said notes then my executor shall sell said property for the purpose of paying said notes. And provided further that at any time, if it shall be deemed necessary by said trustee he may make sale of and execute title of conveyance as therein, to said property or any part of it.

Item 7

I will release further that the residue of my estate of every description shall be sold by my Executor and the proceeds of all just debts & expenses of administration to be equally divided among my children to wit; Henry Shipp trustee for his wife Emily Shipp, Susan May, Mary Walker, Rebecca Shipp,

Item 1

David Shippe, share and share alike - provided however that the distribution share to which my daughter Susan Sney is entitled shall be held by William W Shippe my Executor in trust for her use & benefit, not subject to the debts or liabilities of her present or any future husband.

Item 8

I hereby appointing my brother William W Shippe with full power to execute this my will.
