Item third I give and devise to my beloved wife
Lydia with whom I have lived in love for
thirty two years Lot of Land numbered two hundred
and fifty three in the thirty first dist.
of Marion County containing two
hundred two and a half acres the place now
occupied by me I also give to my wife
Lydia all of my stock of every description
Corn fodder household and kitchen
furniture tools of every description to
have and to hold for the benefit of herself
and our family during her natural life and
at her death my desire is that all my estate
both real and personal shall be equally
divided between our heirs provided William
gets an English Education if not I give
him a half share over and above the rest
of our heirs

Item fourth I constitute my beloved wife Lydia
Executrix and my worthy friend James
McGarrah Executor to this my last will
and Testament this April the 14th 1854
