

Will and Probate of Gracie E. Hammock

State of Georgia- Marion County

n the Name of God Amen:-

I, Mrs. Gracie E. Hammock of said State and County being of advanced age but of sound and disposing mind and memory; knowing that I must shortly depart this life deem it right and proper both as respects my family and myself that I should make a disposition of the property with which a kind providence has blessed me, I do therefore make this my last will and testament hereby revoking and annulling all others by me heretofore made.

First

I desire and direct that my body be buried in a decent and christianlike manner suitable to my circumstances and conditions in life, My soul I trust shall return to rest with God who gave it as I hope for salvation through the merits and atonements of the blessed Lord and Saviour Jesus Christ.

Secondly

I desire and direct that all my just debts be paid without delay by my Executor hereinafter named and appointed.

Thirdly

I give bequeath and devise to my beloved Son, James L. Hammock Lot of land number One Hundred and Ninety One in Eleventh District Marion County known as the Hammock Horse place, said lot containing 202 1/2 acres more or less, with all the rights members and appurtenances to said lot of land in anywise belonging free from all charges and limitations whatever, to his own proper use benefit and behoof forever with full power to dispose of the same by will or otherwise as he may deem proper I also give and bequeath to my beloved son in the same ~~unreserved~~ unreserved manner the farming utensils used on and belonging to the farm on said lot of land, also household and kitchen furniture owned by me on the said farm, also three mules, and all hogs, cows, goats and all other domestic animals that I may have; also wagons and buggies that belong to me on my farm.

Fourthly

I give and bequeath to my six other children, J. W. Hammock, Hope H. Hammock, E. P. Hammock, R. H. Hammock, Charley Hammock and Mrs. Georgia McCrary to share and equal alike Lot of land Number One Hundred and Fifty Nine in the Eleventh District of Marion County containing 202 1/2 acres more or less known as Hally place. That they may hold the said land undivided or it may be sold by my Executor as he may see fit, and money equally divided between the 6 children.

Fifthly

I hereby constitute and appoint my beloved son J. L. Hammock Executor of this my last will and testament This Jan. 10 1910
