I Hiram McCuller being now in low health and knowing
the uncertainty of life and being also of sound mind
and disposable memory do hereby constitute this my
last Will and Testament-

Item 1st I give and bequeath my whole and entire Estate
both real and personal (after the paying of my just
debts) together with its productive, and natural
increase unto my beloved wife Susan McCuller
her only proper use and benefit during her life
and after her death I will that my whole estate
shall then (at her death) and not until then or
any part thereof be equally divided between all
my children to wit Matthew Robertson, Henry
Clinton, Julianne Martha Ann, Susan Missouri Anne,
John Jefferson, Faculty Gray and Hiram McCuller,
and also any that may be born after the date of
this Will or after my demise if they should or
ought to be considered my children (or child)

Item 2nd I also give unto my wife Susan all legacy or legacies
that I have or may inherit, those received and any
to be received to her and her use for and during
her life and then to my children equally as
afforded but forbid a division in part or the
whole during her life-

Item 3^d I hereby appoint my beloved wife Susan McCuller
my Executrix, and my esteemed friend and neighbor
Vincent Hill my Executor of this my last Will and
Testament. Done and executed on this the 5th day
of May in the year of our Lord one thousand eight
hundred and forty one,

aforesaid being in a feeble state of body, and knowing
that I must shortly depart from this world deem it
right and proper both as regards myself and family
that I should make a disposition of the property with
which kind Providence has blessed me. I therefore
make this my last will and Testament hereby re-
voking all writing all others hitherto made by me.

I desire that my body be buried in a decent and
Christian-like manner suitable to my circumstances
and condition, my soul & trust shall return to rest with
God who gave it.

2nd

I desire and direct that all my just debts be paid
without delay by my Executor hereafter named as I am
unwilling my creditors should be delayed of their rights
especially as there is no necessity for delay.

3rd

I give and direct to my beloved wife Sarah Louisa
with whom I have lived in quiet and peace for eighteen
years, all my household furniture, beds bedsteads, tables, chairs,
etc also all my kitchen furniture, pots, pans, and all belonging
to the same, also the lame and limping wheel
two cows of her own choice, one sow & five pigs of her
own choice, one set of plow gear of her own choice
one ax, one weeding hoe of her own choice four fathoming
hogs of her own choice all the corn & fodder raised
on my plantation the present year without reserve
also twenty gallons of syrup of the present crop over
horse waggon, one Turnip shovel and one scoter
plow. All the aforesaid goods & chattels I bequeath
to my wife aforesaid without reserve
