I therefore make this my last will and Testament hereby re-

 I desire that my body be buried in a decent and Christian-like manner suitable to my circumstances and condition, my soul I trust shall return to rest with God who gave it.

I desire and direct that all my just debts be paid without delay by my Executor hereafter named as I am unwilling my creditors should be delayed of their moneys especially as there is no necessity for delay.

I give and devise to my beloved wife Sarah Louisa with whom I have lived in quiet and peaceable years, all my household furniture, beds, bedsteads, tables, chairs, & also all my kitchen furniture, pots, pans, and all belonging to the same, also the loom and spinning wheel two cows of her own choice, one sow & five pigs of her own choice, one set of plow gear of her own choice one ax, one weeding hoe of her own choice four fattening hogs of her own choice all the corn & fodder raised on my plantation the present year without measure also twenty gallons of Syrup of the present crop one horse wagon, one turning shovel and one dozer plow. All the aforesaid goods & chattels & beneath to my wife aforesaid without measure.

The rest of my property both real & personal not aforesaid named, wherever and whatsoever it may be I direct to be sold at public sale at such time as may suit the case and comfort with the law in such cases and the proceeds to be placed to the payment of my just debts.
