 make and publish this my last will and
 testament. Committing my soul to God with

Item 1st I will and desire all my just
 debts be paid as soon as possible, and
 I leave as a caution to my wife
 while she act as my executor, that she
 be exceedingly cautious and not contract
 any more debts than possible;

Item 2^d It is my will and desire that all
 my property both real and personal
 be kept together for the support and maintenance
 of my wife, and for the support maintenance
 and education of my children born and
 to be born. It is my will and desire
 that all my property be kept together for the
 purposes before indicated in this clause
 until my youngest child shall become
 of age

Item 3^d It is my will and desire that my wife
 shall be my executrix, but in the event
 of her marriage that her letters shall obtain
 and the ordinary of the County shall under
 existing rules of law appoint some suitable
 person to execute this my last will and
 testament

Item 4th It is my will and desire that
 my wife while acting as my executrix
 shall have power to sell at any time privately
 or publicly any personal property belonging
 to my estate for reinvestment. But in no case
 shall my wife or other executor sell or
 dispose of the realty belonging to my estate
 except it be done by regular application for leave
 to sell as in other cases of trust property and
 then only for reinvestment.

Item 5th It is my will and desire
 that my children be educated as well
 as fully the proceeds arising from
 my estate will allow, and that all
 my property both real & personal

It is my will and desire that Robert L. Halley and J. J. McCoubert act as advisers of my wife
