

In the name of God, Amen. I James Sanford of the State of Georgia Marion County, being far advanced in age but of sound mind and memory do appoint, ordain and establish this to be my last will and Testament.

- 1st I recommend my soul to Almighty God who gave it, and my body to be decently entred in the dust from which it was taken.
- 2nd My will is, that my funeral expenses and all of my just debts to be paid out of my estate.
- 3^d I have given my daughter Fesoby Rice twenty five hundred dollars and she shall have no more of my estate, nor none of her heirs.
- 4th I have given my daughter Winney Pelt one thousand dollars.
- 5th I have given to my son William Sanford fifteen hundred dollars.
- 6th I have given to my son James W Sanford fifteen hundred dollars.
- 7th I have given to my son Joseph A Sanford fifteen hundred dollars.
- 8th I give unto my son Lewis Sanford four hundred dollars to be collected out of my estate at my decease and he shall have no more of my estate, nor none of his heirs.
- 9th I have given to my son Abner T Sanford six hundred dollars.
- 10th I have given to my son Benjamin W Sanford one thousand dollars.
- 11th I have given unto my son Septimus W Sanford six hundred dollars.
- 12th I have given unto my son Zorny M Sanford two hundred dollars.
- 13th I have given unto my son Franklin Sanford one hundred dollars.
- 14th If I James Sanford should die and my son Zorny M Sanford is living with me and attending to my business he shall have the third of all my crop for that year.
- 15th If it should please Almighty God to call me off after my crop is planted my property shall all remain on my plantation until my crop is made and gathered that year.
- 16 After my decease my will is that all of my estate shall be sold and divided between my daughter Winney Pelt and my sons William Sanford, James W Sanford, Joseph A Sanford, Abner T Sanford, Benjamin W Sanford, Septimus W Sanford, Zorny M Sanford & Franklin Sanford to make them equal according to what I have given off of my estate, as I have charged them above in that my last will and Testament.

Lastly

I do nominate, constitute and appoint Joseph S. D. Weatherall and Henderson Smith my sole Executors of this my last Will and Testament, hereby revoking and making void all and every other Will or Wills at any time heretofore by me made and do declare this to be my last Will and Testament in witness whereof I the said James Langford have hereunto set my hand and seal this eighteenth day of November in the year of our Lord eighteen hundred and fifty one his
