 Item first I desire and direct that my body be buried in a decent and Christian like manner suitable to my circumstances and conditions in life my Soul I trust shall return to God who gave it

Item second I desire that all my just debts be paid by my Executor and Executrix hereafter appointed.

Item third I desire that all my estate to be kept together during the life time or widow of my Present wife Sarah J. Tullis to be used for the support and maintainance of said wife and also for the support and maintainance of my daughter Susan J. Tullis by my deceased wife Patience J. Tullis now if my wife Sarah J. Tullis should marry then my estate to be divided she receiving a child's part but if she should die without marriage then to be equally divided between my heirs by my former wife (to wit) Sewell J. Tullis, Susan J. Tullis and the children of my deceased daughter by my former wife Mary O. Gunnels.

Item fourth I give and bequeath to my son Sewell J. Tullis all my medical Books and Medical Instruments

Item fourth I hereby appoint my son J. M. Tullis as Guardian of the ~~children~~ property of my deceased daughter children that they may inherit by me

Item fifth I hereby appoint my wife Sarah J. Tullis and my son Sewell J. Tullis Executors to this my last will and Testament
