I Isaac Mayo of the State and County
aforesaid being of sound and disposing
mind and memory, and being desirous of
settling my worldly affairs, do make and
publish this my last will and Testament, here-
by revoking and making void all wills
heretofore made by me
First I surrender my Soul to my God, and
my body direct to be buried in a Christian
like manner, suitable to my Conscience and
Circumstances in life, and as to such
worldly estate as it has pleased God to
give me I dispose of the same as hereinafter directed

Second I direct all my just and legal
debts to be paid as soon after my death
as convenient

Third I have heretofore made
advances to my children for which I hold
their note or have the same charged
against them in accounts, and I will
and direct that the same be considered
and accounted for by them at the final
division of my estate and deducted from
their pro rata share.

Fourth It is my will and desire that
my whole estate be divided among my
children share and share alike, the
child or children of my deceased

children to represent the parent (except as hereinafter excepted) and to hold and enjoy the profits of the same for and during their natural lives, and after their death their children to receive the same.

Fifth My grand daughter Elizabeth Tripp and my grand-son George W Mayo having already received their share of my estate, it is my will and direction that they have no further claim on the same, but the share of their father my son Benjamin Mayo, deceased, go to his four youngest children, now living, or such of them as may be living at the time of my death.

Sixth I will and direct that my Executor hereinafter named sell such part of my estate as may be found necessary to make the divisions equal.

Seventh I will to my daughter Penny Tullis my faithful old negro woman named at such valuation as may be ascertained by Commissioners at the final division of my estate.

Eighth I nominate and appoint my sons John Mayo and my son in law Samuel J. Loub Executors to this my last will and testament. In witness whereof I have to set my hand and seal this September 8th 1884.
