I John McMichael of the State and County aforesaid being of sound and disposing mind and memory do make this my last Will & Testament in manner and form as follows:

Item 1st It is my will and desire that my body be decently buried in a Christian like manner.

Item 2^d It is my will that all my just debts be paid by my Executors as soon as possible after my death.

Item 3^d To my beloved wife Mary Jane for her support during her natural life I give and bequeath all the income that may be derived from the interest I have in the Masonic Life Insurance Company.

Item 4th To my two daughters Susan M. and Orrilla H. McMichael and my son John H. McMichael I give and bequeath to each of them the sum Eight hundred dollars to make them as near as I can equal with my other children.

Item 5th To my daughter Catherine H. wife of R. H. Hicks I give the sum of \$600 Six hundred dollars to make her part equal with my other children.

Item 6th It is my will that my Executors sell at public outcry all my property ^{both} personal and real of every description and divide the proceeds of said sale equally between my children and grand children, subject to the following conditions. I am security for William W. Huff for the sum of One thousand dollars with interest now in the event my estate should have to said debt I would be treating my other children unfairly to give his children that he had by my deceased daughter Mary Elizabeth any thing, but should said Wm W. Huff pay off said in full said debt principal and interest then and in that event it is my will that my said grand children, the children of my deceased daughter Mary Elizabeth, shall receive an equal share of my estate, that is the part their mother would have been entitled to if living.

Item 7th I will in trust to my son James R. McMichael all the money that my daughter

Lynethia A Jolly may be entitled to for the use and benefit of my said daughter Lynethia A. Jolly and all the children she now has or may hereafter have, and I do hereby authorize him to use it or invest it in ~~any~~ any way that he may think most conducive to the benefit of my said daughter and her children and that her husband John R. Jolly is in no event whatever to have any control or management of it.

I do hereby nominate and appoint my two sons James R. and William A. McMichael Executors to this my last Will and Testament.

- Item 2^d To my wife Sarah B Clements I do hereby give and bequeath two Bedsteads, Beds and Furniture, one set of chairs, two Rocking Chairs, one Bureau and one Wardrobe, one full tea set and knives, forks and spoons constituting all that is necessary for table use, one table, one yoke of Oxen, two Mules, one plow gear, two plows, two milking cows, all of which she may choose or select
