Item 5th

If my daughter Ernie should die without issue then that part of my estate willed to her that remains at her death be given to my son J. S. Wilson

Item 6th

I appoint my beloved wife Georgia Wilson as Guardian for my minor daughter (child) Ernie Wilson and I also appoint my beloved wife my executrix of this my last will without bond.

Item 7th

It is my will that my executrix sell how much of my buggy as soon possible if not already sold, the proceeds to be

used for the Maintenance.
