I Joseph Daniel of said State and County being of advanced age and knowing that I must shortly depart this life deem it right and proper that I should make a disposition of the property with which a kind Providence has blessed me and therefore make this to be my last will and testament hereby revoking all others heretofore made by me

Item first I desire and direct that my body be buried in a decent and becoming manner suitable to my circumstances in life

Item second I desire and direct that all my just debts be paid as soon as convenient after my death, by my Executors hereinafter appointed

Item third I give bequeath and devise to my beloved wife Mary all of my property of every kind and nature whether real, personal or otherwise to be kept and used by her during her natural life free from the debts contracts or disposition of any other person and at her death to be equally divided among all my children, share and share alike, as well the property left at my as the increase and profits of the same over and above the support of my said wife

Item fourth I hereby constitute and appoint my beloved wife Mary Daniel Executor and my son Henry Daniel Executor of this my last will and testament this October 22nd A.D. 1856
