Item 4th I give and bequeath unto my grand daughter Elizabeth Davis wife of Joshua Davis a negro woman named Phyllis and her increase

Item 5th I give and bequeath unto my great grand daughter Mahala Davis one lot of land numbered one hundred and seventy three in the 1st district of Carroll County named Carroll County also one lot of land named Bob

Item 6th I give and bequeath unto Susan Davis my great grand daughter daughter of Joshua Davis one lot of land numbered one hundred and seventy three in the 1st district of Carroll County also one lot of land named Bob

Item 7th I give and bequeath unto Susan Davis daughter of said Joshua Davis one lot of land in the County of Carroll also one lot of land named Bob
