I do therefore make this my last Will and
 Testament, hereby revoking and annulling
 all others heretofore by me made.

^{Fish} I desire that my body be buried in a
 decent and Christian-like manner suita-
 ble to my circumstances and condition in
 life my soul I trust shall return to rest
 with God who gave it as I hope for sal-
 vation through the merits and atonement
 of our blessed Lord and Savior Jesus Christ.

^{Second} I desire and direct that all my
 just debts be paid by my Executors here-
 after named and appointed.

^{Third} I give and bequeath and devise to
 my beloved daughter Alice A. Hanley
 the House and Lot in the town of Queen-
 vista owned by me known as (the) Lot
 No 29 X 30 in Block 8 in the plan of said
 Town containing five or more acres with
 all the rights members and appurtenances
 to said House and Lot in any wise be-
 longing free from all charge and inci-
 tation whatever to her own proper use
 benefit and behoof forever with full
 power to dispose of the same by will or
 otherwise as she may deem proper. I also
 give to my beloved daughter Alice A.
 Hanley in the same unreserved manner
 all the personal property that I own asso-
 ciated with all kinds whatever.

^{Fourth} I hereby constitute and appoint my
 friend James L Baker Executor of this
 my last Will and Testament.

To give and bequeath to my son W. H.
 Hanley five dollars and my daughter
 Mary Praying two five dollars

Whereas James A. Hall has offered for Pro-
bate in Common form of law a copy Will

Webb two of the witnesses to said lost
original Will that the copy Will offered
for Probate is a true copy of said original,
and it further appears that said Marta
Stanley signed said lost original in the
presence of witnesses and one Lee Will
Buffle now dead and they signed the
same in the presence of each other and
of Testatrix and that Testatrix was of
sound mind at the time and that she
signed the same of her own accord.

Therefore it is ordered and ad-
judged by the Court that said copy be
declared to be the Will of said deceased
and admitted to Probate and record in
Common form of law.
