 knowing that I must shortly depart this life
 deem it right and proper both as respects my
 family and myself that I should make a
 disposition of the property with which a
 kind Providence has blessed me —

I do therefore make this my last Will and
 Testament hereby revoking and annulling
 all others heretofore by me made

First I desire that my body be buried in a
 decent and Christian-like manner suit-
 able to my circumstances and condition in
 life my Soul I trust shall return to rest
 with God who gave it as I hope for sal-
 vation through the merits and atonement
 of our blessed Lord and Savior Jesus Christ.

Second I desire and direct that all my
 just debts be paid by my Executors here-
 inafter named and appointed.

Third I give and bequeath and devise to
 my beloved daughter Alice A Hunley
 the House and Lot in the town of Buen-
 avista owned by me known as (the) Lot
 No 29 x 30 in Block A in the plan of said
 town containing five or more acres with
 all the rights members and appurtenances
 to said House and Lot in any wise be-
 longing free from all charge and limi-
 tation whatever to her own proper use
 benefit and behoof forever with full
 power to dispose of the same by will or
 otherwise as she may deem proper. I also
 give to my beloved daughter Alice A.
 Hunley in the same unreserved manner
 all the personal property that I own and
 possess of all kinds whatever.

Fourth I hereby constitute and appoint my
 friend James L Baker Executor of this
 my last Will and Testament

Fifth I give and bequeath to my son M. M.
 Hunley five dollars, and my daughter
 M. M. Huntington five dollars
 this 18. Decr 1868 Martha Hunley (L.S.)
