a man and Chorty and her child

Item 2nd I give and bequeath unto my grand daughter
Mary Reil Maddux a nego girl named Callie

Item 3rd I give devise and bequeath unto my Children Wm. A.
Glaze Francis R. French wife of Helene J. French
Sarah C. Maddux wife of David R. Maddux
and the children of John M. Glaze deceased all
the rest and residue of my estate the said Children
of John M. Glaze deceased representing these deceased
father and taking one fourth interest in said residue
the part or portion going to said Francis R. French and
Sarah C. Maddux to them during their lives free from
the debts contracts or liabilities of these present or my
future husband and after their deaths to their children

Item 4th I will and desire that said David R. Maddux be good
he is hereby appointed trustee for said Mary Reil to hold
said negro in trust for said Mary Reil without accounting
until she arrives at full age or marriage

Item 5 I hereby nominate my son Wm. A. Glaze my executor
hoping and believing that he will see that this my will
is faithfully carried out and in case it should be
necessary for him to sell or dispose of any of my property
towards the proper execution thereof he is hereby empowered
to sell privately or publicly as to him shall seem meet

fifty nine

 negroes which I now have possession of
 and those which I may hereafter obtain
 or may belong to my Estate by virtue of the
 Wills of my said husband, Daniel M. Hall
 and my said father John Hall, or other
 wife be divided equally between my
 sons, James W. Hall and Daniel M. Hall,
 and my daughters Sarah Melson Cox, Mary
 Elizabeth O'Bannon, Leale L. Hall, Pamela
 C. Blake, and Martha R. Hall. To each of
 them an equal share of said negroes during
 their lifetime and when either of my said
 sons or daughters may die that portion which
 may be or she may have need to go to and
 belong to her children.
 I do hereby property in no respect to be
 subject to the debts or liabilities of my said
