children that I should make a disposition
of the property with which a kind Providence
has blessed me. I therefore make and publish
this as my last will and testament hereby
revoking and annulling all others heretofore
made by me and first I commit my Soul
to the God who gave it and my body I
desire and direct to be buried in a decent
and Christian like manner and my worldly es-
tate I dispose of as follows:

I desire and direct that all my just
debts be paid without delay by my Executor
hereinafter named as I am unwilling that
my creditors should be delayed of their just
rights, especially as there is no necessity of
delay

I desire and direct that all of my
property both real and personal wherever
and whatsoever kind it may be that it

be sold by executors hereinafter named to the highest bidder at the usual place of selling such property, that the proceeds of the same be equally divided among my several children share and share alike and that my Grand children (the children of my daughter Lucinda Anderson), to be entitled to one share (that is one seventh part of my estate)

Item third - I desire and direct that the share that my daughter Emily E. May may be entitled unto under the provisions of this will, shall vest alone in her and her children that she now has or may hereafter have by her present or any future husband and not to be subject to the debts of her present or any future husband that she has or may hereafter have, but alone for her and her children's use -

Item fourth - I desire and direct that the share that my daughter Frances Ann Wright may be entitled unto under the provisions of this will, shall vest alone in her and her children that she now has or may hereafter have by her present or any future husband and not to be subject to the debts of her present or any future husband that she has or may hereafter have, but alone for her and her children's use.

Item fifth - I hereby constitute James L. Baker my son and John W. Wright my son in law Executors of this my last will and testament In witness whereof I the said Nancy Baker have to this my last will, set my hand and Seal this the 16th day of November 1859
