Charity Pearson to have and hold for the sole  
benefit of herself and two youngest daughters  
during the natural life of the said Charity and  
until the said daughters shall have married after  
which I desire and direct my Executor to sell said  
land so that all her heirs shall share and share  
alike

Item 4 I hereby constitute and appoint my son Thom-  
as W. Harvey Executor of this my last will and  
testament
