Testament, hereby revoking all Wills here-
before made by me.

Item 1st It is my will and desire that all my
just debts be paid by my Executor hereinafter
named as soon after my death as con-
venient.

Item 2nd My wife Sarah Langley having sep-
arated from me and left my ~~good~~ and
Board, and she having received and now
has all the property (or its equivalent) that
she had at the time of our marriage. It is
my will and desire that she receive nothing
from my estate.

Item 3rd My widowed daughter Elizabeth
Ruff is now living with me, and is taking
kind care of me. It is therefore my will and
desire, and I do hereby will and bequeath
to her the whole of my estate whether real or
personal, or mixed.

Item 4th I hereby nominate and appoint
William S. Wiggins Executor to this my
last will and Testament.

- Item 3rd I give and bequeath unto my daughter Mary Walker wife of J. M. Walker the sum of One hundred dollars to be paid to her by my executor out of any funds in his hands belonging to me.
- Item 4 I give and bequeath unto my grand daughter Louisa Walker the sum of One hundred dollars to be paid to her lawful guardian of my
