This being the last will and Testament of Owen Tomblin he being in health and of a sound and disposing mind, makes the following disposition of his Estate to wit, after paying all my just debts I give and bequeath unto my wife Mary J. Tomblin all my property both real and personal to wit, (I am negroes stock of all kind, horse hold and kitchen furniture) there with other things or things that may belong to the Estate. And the said Mary J. Tomblin at her death to act and do with it as she may think proper. And I do by these presents constitute nominate and appoint Mary J. Tomblin my lawful Executor to this my last Will and Testament.

I do hereby utterly disallow revoke & disannul all and every other will & Testament, legacy, bequeathes by me in anywise before mentioned ratifying and confirming this and no other or to be my last Will and Testament.
